FIRE SERVICES – SWATARA TOWNSHIP

Swatara Township Police Chief and Director of Public Safety, Darrell Reider, Michael Ibberson, Director of Fire and Emergency Services with Swatara Township, Swatara Township Commissioner Thomas Connolly, and Chief Brenden Orth, Health and Safety Officer, were attending this evenings meeting to present a proposal for fire protection from Swatara Township.

Swatara Township Fire Chief, Michael Ibberson thanked Council for the opportunity to present a proposal for fire services highlighting operational benefits, health and safety benefits, administrative benefits, accomplishments of the Swatara Township Fire Department, data strategic planning, benefits and incentives to volunteers, and benefits to Paxtang Borough residents. Members of Council were provided with an Intergovernmental Agreement Proposal for Fire Protection.

Discussion was held on the following: response time and the availability of manpower to Paxtang Borough, response from Chief Ibberson, Chief Reider, and Commissioner Connolly was that Swatara Township will be erecting a new public safety building in 2021, suggested at least one fire engine be housed at Paxtang until more data is gathered with regard to actual usage, a shortened response time due to paid firefighters positioned at each station as opposed to firefighters leaving from their homes, increase in traffic from surrounding area, having Paxtang respond to incidents within the Borough, have representation from a Paxtang resident or firefighter, concerns with ownership and maintenance of fire apparatus, no fundraising requirements, and multiple benefits to firefighters and Borough residents by joining with Swatara. Chief Ibberson proceeded with his resume as requested by President Bloss.

Members of Council expressed their gratitude to all the Swatara presenters and thanked them for their informative and comprehensive presentation and booklets offered to them.

Councilman Eisner said he appreciates the service provided and that it was he goal to see the Paxtang Fire Company succeed.
