THE PAXTON RANGERS: JULY 11, 1763 – AUGUST 5, 1764

The subject of Jim Bruce's talk is Captain Clayton's and Captain Green's Ranger Companies and the role they played in Lancaster, Dauphin, and Lebanon County history during Pontiac's War. These military units were authorized by the lieutenant governor and commander-in-chief of the Province of Pennsylvania and commanded by the Reverend John Elder, the pastor of Paxton Presbyterian Church, from July 11, 1763, to December 29, 1763, and by Major Asher Clayton from December 29, 1763, until they were disbanded in 1764. As many of the recruits of these military units came from what was then Paxtang Township, Lancaster County, in what is now Dauphin County, they were commonly called "Paxton Rangers." These ranger units should not be confused with the more widely known "Paxton Boys," a group of vigilantes that was active during the same period.

Jim Bruce is a member of the Paxton Presbyterian Church History Committee. He is a graduate of Duke University and Dickinson School of Law and, prior to his retirement, was assistant chief counsel of the Pennsylvania Department of Revenue. A Vietnam War veteran, Jim was assigned to the 28th Military History Detachment of the 11th Armored Cavalry Regiment in 1968-1969. He is also a family historian and Civil War enthusiast, tracking the 6th New Hampshire Infantry Regiment during the time his great-grandfather served in the unit.

WATER BASIN PROJECT

The stormwater requirements of the federal Clean Water Act are administered under the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection's (DEP) Municipal Separate Storm Sewer (MS4) Program. In December 2002, DEP issued a general Permit for use by MS4s that fall under the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Phase II program, requiring the implementation of a stormwater program for minimizing the impacts from runoff.

The purpose of the project at the intersection of Prince Street and Park Terrace is to show the improvements of and to expand the existing stormwater area to create an infiltration basin. An infiltration basin is a type of best management practice (BMP) that is used to manage stormwater runoff, prevent flooding and downstream erosion, and improve water quality in an adjacent river, stream, lake or bay. Infiltration basins can also provide recreational, wildlife habitat or aesthetic benefits, in addition to stormwater control.

This project will help Paxtang Borough earn credits for their MS4 permit, which is a requirement every 5 years. This is a state regulated and mandatory permit to help clean our stormwater. Along with earning credits, this project will help reduce flooding that occurs downstream near Brisban Street, as well as reduce the amount of pollutants that enter our waterway. The infiltration basin allows the water to naturally filter into the ground.

The project at the intersection of Prince Street and Park Terrace was primarily funded thru a grant from DEP. This was the first of two BMP projects along Park Terrace and the Greenbelt which have been awarded grants. The second project will be near the intersection of Brookwood Street and Park Terrace and will be constructed within the next 12 months.


